SPEED FOR BURBANK.

Both Rural Mail Routes Running Out of That Town Now Served With Automobiles.

BURBANK, May 18-J. A. Snall. carrier on rural mail route No. 1 has purchased an automobile and is now serving his patrons with the machine. Mrs. Beal on route No. 2 has been servling her patrons for some time in the same manner. Much time is saved in using the automobiles as heretofore it took the greater part of the day to deliver the mail, while now both carriers return and are at the office by noon, giving ample time for outgoing mail to get away for all points; leaving the office at 1:30 o'clock p.m., Burbank is said to be the only rural district in California that enjoys such rural service.
